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## How a bat box should be? General guidelines

To install a bat box, some **GENERAL GUIDELINES** must be taken into account in order to increase the chances of occupation, independently of the location and the typology of the bat box.



- 1. They can be installed on façades, trees, electric posts or any other **vertical structure**.
- 2. They must be set up at a minimum of **3 metres** of height (recommended between 3 and 4 metres).
- 3. The bat boxes must be **fixed** and **stable** (they should not swing).
- 4. When installing the bat boxes, make sure that they can **properly** and **easily** be **checked.**
- 5. Bat box entrance must be **obstacle-free** (branches, railings, windowsills, roofs, etc.). They must be placed in **OPEN SPACES.**
- 6. They have to be installed in **dark places** with low lighting, avoiding street lamps or artificial lights.
- 7. Do not place them near doors or windows.
- 8. To avoid **predation** (cats and birds) do not place them near branches or windowsills.
- 9. In **warm and sunny environments**, do not face them to the south to avoid an excessive insolation. In these conditions avoid using black or dark bat boxes.
- 10. In **fresh and shading environments**, do not face them to the north.
- 11. If it is possible, we recommend you to install them in solitary and remote places, near feeding areas such as wetlands, rivers, ponds or meadows.
